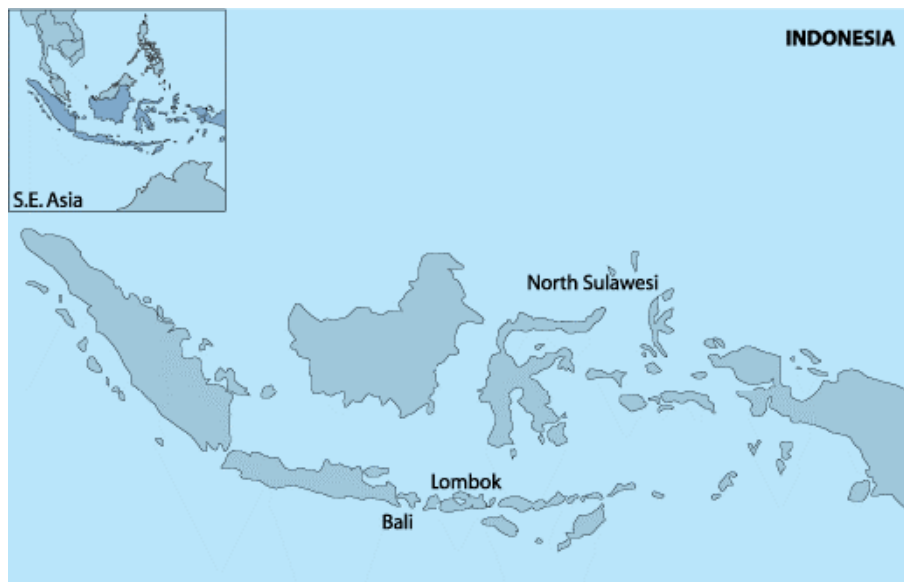

### TRAVEL & LODGING GUIDE

IFIP's 2011 Asia-Pacific Regional Conference will be held in Bali and Lombok, Indonesia, renowned for their beautiful scenery and unique culture.



## Meeting Venue

- **In Bali**, the meeting venue for March 27th and 28th is at Baliwoso Camp, an agro and culture adventure camp located in Dusun Delod Umah, Pengotan Village, Bangli Regency. Pengotan Village is a customary village where land is collectively owned. It lies in about 1,000 meters above sea level, 70 km North East of Ngurah Rai International Airport of Bali, 5 km South of Lake Batur, Kintamani, or 15 km north of Bangli, the capitol city of Bangli Regency.

## Travel Guide

Conference participants are responsible for making their own flight arrangements for their arrival in Bali and departure from Lombok.

The Conference Organizer will arrange the transfer from Bali to Lombok based on information provided by participants in the Registration Form.

We strongly recommend that you make arrangements as soon as possible.

### Arrival at Bali (arranged by participants)

Participants who want to join the Pre-site Visit should arrive Bali on Friday March 25th. Those who want to join the Conference should arrive Bali on Saturday March 26th around noon or earlier. The distance between Ngurah Rai International Airport and the meeting venue at BaliWoso Camp is 1,5 to 2 hours drive.

### Transfer from Bali to Lombok on March 29th morning (arranged by Conference Organizer)

- by fast boat: departs Padangbai Harbour, Bali at 8:00 AM  
arrive Lembar Harbour, Lombok at 10:00 AM

### Departure from Lombok

Participants may choose to be transferred back to Bali on Wednesday March 30th, or leave for Jakarta before leaving for their next destination. The Conference Organizer will make the arrangement for Lombok to Bali transportation based on information provided by participants in the Registration Form. Participants are to arrange themselves the transportation from Lombok to Jakarta.

#### ➤ from **Lombok to Bali**

- by airplane (35 minutes flight)
  - Garuda Indonesia      departs 20:30
  - Lion Air                      departs 17:05
  - Merpati                        departs 17:00
- by ferry (4,5 hours): every hour, from Lembar Harbour
- by fast boat (2 hours): departs 4 PM from Teluk Nara

#### **The fast boat trip is NOT suitable for**

- Pregnant women
- People with back and heart problem or other physical impediments
- Infant not recommended for this trip. However if the parents insist, they must complete a Disclaimer letter releasing the Company Name and all its officers and /or employees, agents from negligence and any further legal action by any Party, prior to the trip commencement.

  - leaves Lombok in the morning:
    - Garuda Indonesia      departs 06:55 and 09:35
    - Lion Air                      departs 06:00
  - leaves Lombok in the afternoon:
    - Lion Air                      departs 12:30 and 16:20

### Ground transportation in Bali and Lombok

Conference Organizer will arrange the ground transportation for the followings:

- pick up from airport upon arrival, and transfer to airport upon departure time
- pre-site visits
- to/from airport or to/from harbour for the transfer to Lombok vice versa

Ubud is a remarkable town in the middle of the island of Bali, it is the island's preeminent centre for fine arts, dance and music. We would pass through Tegallalang for the beautiful *padi* rice field views.

Pengotan Village is a customary village where land is collectively owned. It lies in about 1,000 meters above sea level, 70 km North East of Ngurah Rai International Airport of Bali, 5 km South of Lake Batur, Kintamani, or 15 km north of Bangli, the capitol city of Bangli Regency. The Camp was developed to promote conservation of nature and local culture and at the same time give sustainable benefits to local communities. The guests are, therefore, encouraged to respect and adjust to the nature and local people, and accordingly must behave responsibly but still can have so much fun while staying in the specially designed Serengeti Tents. 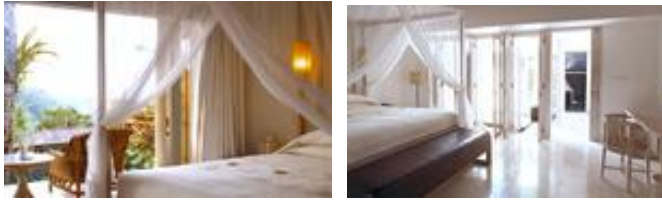

## VISA ON ARRIVAL

In accordance with the Regulation of Minister of Law and Human Right of the Republic of Indonesia Number: M.HH-01.GR.01.06, on January 12, 2010, citizen from 63 countries and 1 region are eligible for obtaining **Visa on Arrival (VOA)**.

This visa can be obtained directly when you are landed at the certain airports and seaport in Indonesia regardless of the purpose of your visits (Business, Tourist, Social). **The Visa on Arrival is not a work visa nor a visitation visa. Therefore, it can not be converted to obtain other immigration permits.** The maximum stays permitted for the visa on arrival is 30 days. If you plan to stay longer than 30 days, you need to mention your intention to stay longer. Visa on Arrival can be extended for another 30 days.

The general requirements for Visa On Arrival are:

- Expiration date of the applicant's passport must be at least 6 (six) months at the date of entry.
- Round-trip airplane ticket
- Fees

The fees for Visa On Arrival are:

- Visa for stay up to 30 (thirty) days = **US\$ 25,-**
- Extension of stay for up to 30 (thirty) days = **US\$ 25,-**
